A year-long programme of contemporary visual art at the Swiss Church in London

'In this world which we enter, appearing from a nowhere, and from which we disappear into a nowhere, Being and Appearing coincide... In 2017, the Swiss Church in London will host its first year-long curated programme of contemporary visual art. It aims to support artists to develop new work in response to the architecture or socio-historical context of the Church, and in doing so, further the dialogue between art and faith established by the Church's cultural programming over the past six years.

The Swiss Church was founded by a group of Swiss citizens living in London 250 years ago. The programme takes advantage of this context to address current debates surrounding immigration, public space, propaganda, mental health and community protest.

Being and Appearing takes its title from German-American political theorist Hannah Arendt's conception of the space of appearing: a temporary space formed when actors meet to discuss matters of public concern. Focusing on site-specific live art practices, the programme considers the church as a public space in which communities meet, debate and then disband. The selected projects return performance to a place of worship — in Ancient Greece for example, temples were used for both theatre and religion — as well as referencing the 500th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation, celebrated in 2017.

Being and Appearing is curated by Kirsty White.
