Five-hundred years ago the reformation started in Europe. One of the main aims of the reformation movement was to enable people to read and interpret the Bible autonomously and to find their own language to express their faith. Church traditions were critically reflected and the relationship between God and the believers no longer depended on the Priest's interpretation.

Today we live in an increasingly secular society and many find it hard to believe in God. We struggle with the biblical message which often seems to contradict scientific knowledge. We also find that we don't have

the basic biblical knowledge to form our own opinions.

This course is an opportunity to learn, discuss and find your own words for what you believe. We are all different, and so is our faith!
